BOIL WATER ADVISORY

A boil water advisory is in effect for customers with running tap water:

- Boil water for at least one minute, even if filtered
- If boiling is not possible, add 8 drops of bleach per 1 gallon of water
- Use bottled water for drinking, food preparation, infant formula, and pets
- Do not use ice made from un-boiled water
- For hand washing, use boiled/bottled water or hand sanitizer if unavailable
- Do not use water from connected appliances (e.g., refrigerator dispensers)

BURNING REGULATIONS

Open burning is allowed with exceptions:

- Burning of trash that grows naturally in the community is permittable in piles more than 15 feet away from structures and no higher than 3 feet.
- Let materials dry for at least 3 days before burning
- Do not burn trash, cardboard, building materials, or painted/processed wood

SCHOOLS

All facilities are without water, and many have minimal power. This, along with road impacts on bus routes, is preventing schools from reopening. Although there is currently no definitive timeline for reopening, schools are looking into renting restroom trailers or accessing groundwater through the drilling of wells. If successful, schools on select campuses have the potential of opening in two weeks, with other openings stemming from there.

Today, a dedicated team of 51 Asheville City Schools staff, community members, and district leadership also gathered to plan interim in-person and remote learning experiences to keep students engaged and progressing both academically and socially. Information on those efforts will be announced when a plan is in place.

Daily food distribution will begin on Wednesday, October 9, at the William Randolph Campus and Hall Fletcher Elementary School from 11 AM – 1 PM. This service will provide meals to children ages birth to 18, including a to-go lunch and breakfast for the following day.

Schools are working to account for all staff members. If you work for these schools, please contact someone to let them know you are safe.

TRASH AND RECYCLING

- Materials not collected: mud, construction debris, concrete, other bulky or hazardous items
- Debris collection will be at no cost to residents and is estimated to start in mid-October. Announcements will be made in advance of what neighborhoods will be serviced on what day. Residents are asked to remember that debris removal personnel cannot go onto residential properties, so please pull debris to the public right of ways or curbs within neighborhoods.

WATER SYSTEM REPAIRS:

UPS locations in **Hendersonville** and **Asheville** are operational but continue to face challenges due to power outages, flooding, and blocked roads. Both sites are currently running on **portable generators**. Package deliveries are increasing as road conditions improve daily. USPS anticipates continued improvement in mail delivery operations as local recovery efforts progress. This includes restoring power, internet connectivity, and clearing roadways. However, some facilities remain **closed** or **partially operational** due to ongoing road closures and infrastructure issues.
