

BOIL WATER ADVISORY

A boil water advisory is in effect for customers with running tap water:

• Boil water for at least one minute, even if filtered

- If boiling is not possible, add 8 drops of bleach per 1 gallon of water
- Use bottled water for drinking, food preparation, infant formula, and pets
- Do not use ice made from un-boiled water
- For hand washing, use boiled/bottled water or hand sanitizer if unavailable
- Do not use water from connected appliances (e.g., refrigerator dispensers)

BURNING REGULATIONS

Under no circumstances is open burning allowed within Asheville City Limits. All burning must take place outside of city limits and adhere to the below:

- Only the burning of trash that grows naturally is permittable in piles more than 15 feet away from structures and no higher than 3 feet.
- Let materials dry for at least 3 days before burning
- Do not burn trash, cardboard, building materials, or painted/processed wood

- Deadline: Dec. 2, 2024

DOCUMENTATION:

- All required documentation must be submitted within 21 days of application
- DES will work with those who cannot provide all documentation to avoid benefit delays

POWER RESTORATION

Duke Energy:

PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

ART (Asheville Redefines Transit) bus service:

- Limited service beginning October 7
- Using modified Sunday route schedule daily from 8 AM 5 PM
- Last outbound trips end at 5 PM due to 7:30 PM curfew
- Free rides until October 14
- Flag-stop service available (board at any point by flagging down the bus)

Flag Stop instructions:

- Can catch the bus anywhere along the route where safe and accessible
- Must use designated stop to get off the bus
- Raise arm and wave to signal the driver
- Ensure driver can see you if not at an official stop
- Bus will only pick up riders on the same side of the street it's traveling

SCHOOLS

Asheville City Schools has announced a targeted date of October 28 (subject to change) for the reopening of all city-wide schools. Community members will receive a minimum of 72-hours' notice in order to prepare.

Bridge Learning is scheduled to begin on October 14, with more information provided closer to that date.

A workshop for college admissions will take place tomorrow, October 10, from 2:00 PM – 6:00 PM on the Randolph Community College campus. Area seniors will be provided with a hot meal and assistance with college application essay creation and the submission of applications in a secure internet setting.

Daily food distribution is taking place at the William Randolph Campus and Hall Fletcher Elementary School from 11 AM – 1 PM. This service will provide meals to children ages birth to 18, including a to-go lunch and breakfast for the following day.

There is currently no date for the reopening of Buncombe County Schools. Community members will receive a minimum of 72-hours' notice in order to prepare.

Schools are working to account for all staff members. If you work for these schools, please contact someone to let them know you are safe.

SEWERAGE

Buncombe County's sewer system remains operational, but please check the lines on your own property for any damage before using.

The Metropolitan Sewerage District administration building is now open to the public, at 2028 Riverside Dr. in Asheville. You can visit in person, but if you have a sewer emergency you can also call 828-768-0540.

Crews are working around the clock to secure the system, but the treatment plant was unaffected except for a temporary loss of power. All 40 pump stations are back online

with some running on generator power. Main "interceptor" lines are working. Crews are assessing the other 1,100 miles of smaller lines.

TAX RELIEF

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has announced tax relief for certain taxpayers affected by Hurricane Helene. The federal tax relief gives affected taxpayers until May 1, 2025, to file various federal individual and business tax returns and make tax payments.

Affected taxpayers include:

- Individuals who live in North Carolina
- Businesses (including tax-exempt organizations) whose principal place of business is in North Carolina
- Other individuals and businesses whose records necessary to meet a State tax deadline are located in North Carolina
- Relief workers who are assisting in North Carolina and are affiliated with a recognized government or philanthropic organization
- Any individual visiting North Carolina who was killed or injured as a result of the disaster.

TRASH AND RECYCLING

*** Friday, October 11: Any bagged household trash can be taken to the Buncombe County Pool, 734 Clarks Chapel Rd., for disposal. ***

City of Asheville:

- Curbside collection of household waste (bagged trash only) has resumed
- Regular routes based on road accessibility
- Do not put storm debris in trash bins
- No recycling pickup until recycling plant is operational
- Use both recycling and trash carts for household waste
- All waste collected as trash by City of Asheville and Curbie vehicles

- Materials not collected: mud, construction debris, concrete, other bulky or hazardous items
- Debris collection will be at no cost to residents and is estimated to start in mid-October. Announcements will be made in advance of what neighborhoods will be serviced on what day. Residents are asked to remember that debris removal personnel cannot go onto residential properties, so please pull debris to the public right of ways or curbs within neighborhoods.

WATER SYSTEM REPAIRS:

- Tropical Storm Helene severely damaged Asheville's water production and distribution system
- Extensive repairs required for treatment facilities, pipes, and washed-out roads
- Full system restoration could take weeks
- Some areas will regain service before others based on damage levels

Weaverville water system: Fully operational (boil water advisory in effect)

Woodfin water plant: Operating, access restored, repairing pipeline breaks (no timeline for service restoration)

FOR THOSE WITH WATER SERVICE:

- Boil water advisory in effect
- Boil for at least one minute, even if filtered
- If boiling not possible, use bottled water for drinking and food preparation
- Use bottled water for infant formula and pets
- Do not use ice made from un-boiled water
- For hand washing, use boiled or bottled water (use hand sanitizer if neither available)
- Do not use water from connected appliances (e.g., refrigerator water dispensers)

WATER

The Mills River plant, which primarily serves South Asheville, is fully operational. The city is asking those with water to conserve.

The William DeBruhl plant (Bee Tree) had waterlines demolished in the storm and is currently inaccessible until roads are repaired.

North Fork has seen significant improvement in the completion of connectivity to the water distribution system. Water must now be passed through the lines and tested.

WELL WATER TESTING

For flooded wells:

- Disinfect the well and have water tested before use
- Boil water for at least one minute if using before testing
- Buncombe County began coordinating water testing Monday, October 7
- Call 828-250-5016 to have your water tested and for information on how to test your well

Free well testing kits providing a sample container, and information on how to disinfect your well and collect an effective sample can be picked up at the Permits and Inspections Department, 30 Valley Rd., Monday – Friday from 8 AM – 4 PM. There is a two-day turnaround time for results.

It is important to note that all wells being drilled on properties MUST have a permit. People cannot drill wells without those permits in place. Permits can also be applied for at the Permits and Inspection Department, 30 Valley Rd.

Potable vs Nonpotable Water:

Potable water is safe for drinking and non-potable is not.

Potable Water: This is water that is safe to drink and use for food preparation. It meets safety and health standards, typically set by governments or regulatory bodies, and is free from harmful contaminants such as bacteria, viruses, chemicals, and toxins.

Non-Potable Water: This water is not safe for drinking or food preparation due to the presence of contaminants, pollutants, or chemicals. It may be used for purposes such as irrigation, industrial processes, flushing toilets, laundry, or cleaning, but should never be consumed without proper treatment.
