#### **Local Updates**

Public officials are holding news briefings each day at **11 a.m**. The briefings are streamed live on the <u>Buncombe County Facebook Page</u> and broadcasted on Blue Ridge Public Radio 88.1 FM. You can also listen on the iHeart radio stations including 99.9, 104.3, 105.1, 105.9, 96.5, 98.1, 105.5 and 97.3 (Spanish) and 570 AM.

#### TRASH COLLECTION

Trash pickup resumed Monday, with Monday and Tuesday regular routes. Due to roadway challenges, crews were unable to complete the routes and will resume today (10/8). Updates for regular routes will be provided Download the AVL Collects app to receive notifications about trash and recycling pickup in your area. There is currently no recycling pick up. Residents should use both recycling and trash carts for household waste. Do not put limbs, yard debris, construction debris, carpet, concrete, or other bulky or hazardous items in your trash cart. These materials will be collected separately by a contractor at a later date.

# **BUS SERVICE**

### **FOOD & WATER DISTRIBUTION**

Food in the form of Meals Ready to Eat (MRE), drinking water and nonpotable water for flushing toilets are available at the below listed distribution sites today. Distribution will last from 9 a.m - 7 p.m. or until supplies run out. The public will need to bring their own containers for non potable water. # **CELLULAR SERVICE & WI-FI**

Temporary Verizon cellular satellite trailers are located at the **YMCA** at 30 Woodfin Street and **Groce United Methodist Church** at 954 Tunnel Road. These towers offer limited cellular reception within several city blocks of where it is parked. T-Mobile has set up satellite cellular on light trucks in Asheville, providing cellular service along with Wi-Fi and charging stations at: **Asheville Middle School** at 211 S French Broad Ave, and **Dr. Wesley Grant Sr. Southside Community Center** at 285 Livingston St. ITDRC, a private entity, is providing Wi-Fi hotspots and charging stations for public use at **Sam's Club** at 645 Patton Ave and **Haw Creek Commons** at 315 Old Haw Creek Rd.

#### WATER UTILITY SERVICE

The beginning of water restoration is contingent on two important things happening: 1) completion of North Fork's 36-inch bypass line rebuild, which we hope to accomplish later this week, and 2) the ability to put water into the system. Pushing the sediment-filled water through our filters would damage them beyond repair, and set back the process. We are working with the EPA on some turbidity-reducing measures. Once water is able to leave the North Fork, city crews will have to fill tanks, repair pipe leaks, and remove air locks from the distribution system. Mills River treatment plant, which serves South Asheville, is operating at normal output. While most of the service area has been pressurized, there are still pockets that have not received water service. Water Resources maintenance staff is working to bring water to the entire service area as quickly as possible. A boil water advisory remains in effect for those whose water has returned. We are also asking customers with water service to conserve it as much as possible. Water restoration will occur slowly and incrementally. As we have said from the beginning, full operation of the system could potentially be weeks away.

### **ASHEVILLE POLICE DEPARTMENT**

APD is at full patrol staffing with additional support from outside law enforcement agencies. Officers are providing security at critical infrastructure sites, medical facilities, and pharmacies. They continue to conduct searches and rescues, welfare checks, reunification with families, and secure areas with severe damage.

# **ASHEVILLE FIRE DEPARTMENT**

AFD continues efforts in heavily affected areas and canvassing neighborhoods for needs. For those needing medical assistance or for those who cannot call 911, each fire station will have a firefighter available 24/7. AFD continues to receive assistance from outside fire department agencies from across the state. Burning yard waste and debris is not allowed within city limits due to many safety concerns. Debris collection is estimated to start mid-October—more details to come. Report any hazardous materials to <a href="mailto:ncdwmspills@deg.nc.gov">ncdwmspills@deg.nc.gov</a>.

### **DEVELOPMENT SERVICES**

The Development Services Department is set up to receive and issue permits for structures and buildings that have received storm damage. Permit fees will be waived for removal and repair permits. Emergency permits will be fast tracked. Assessors and City staff will have identification and will identify which department they are working for.
